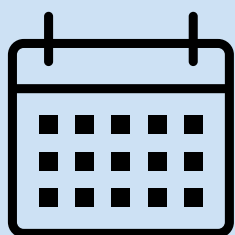

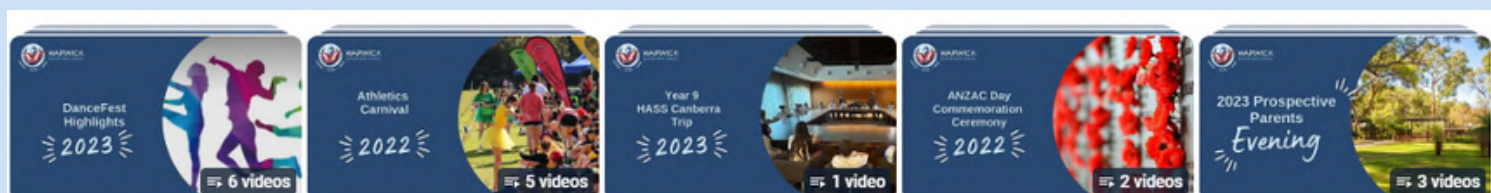

TRY A TRADE

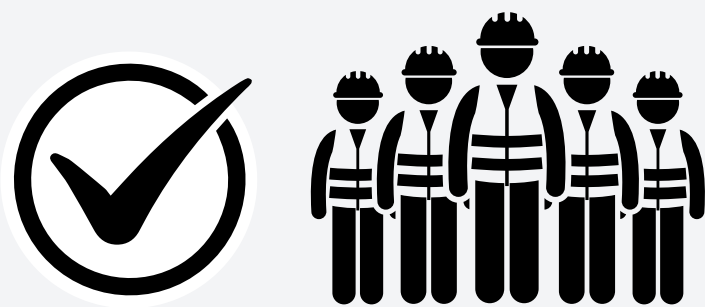


This term Warwick SHS students from Years 9 and 10 were invited to participate in a three day Try a Trade activity. The program is designed as a first step, for those who demonstrate an interest, to explore a career in building and construction. It gives students a taste of different trade areas, to allow them to make more informed choices for their future careers.

Try a Trade exposes students to an authentic trade training environment, with courses coordinated and delivered by specialist trade training organisations and trade qualified lecturers. Students were given the opportunity to try painting and plumbing, or bricklaying and carpentry. Along with the trade tasting, they also had the added bonus of being exposed to an adult learning environment at registered trade organisations.

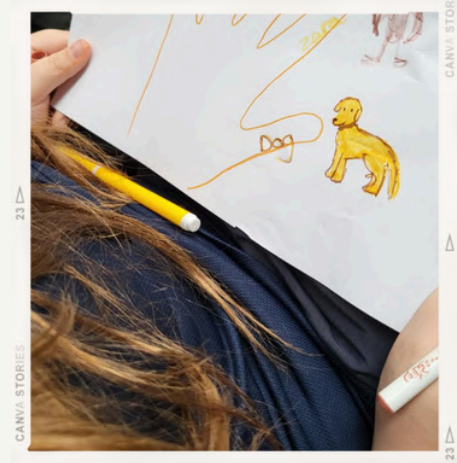


headspace Connection and Loneliness

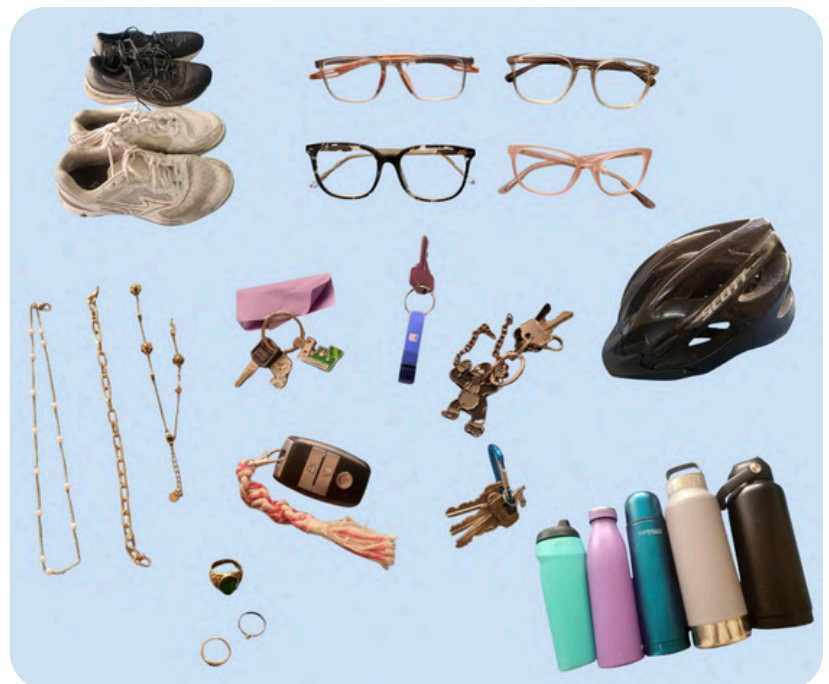
